

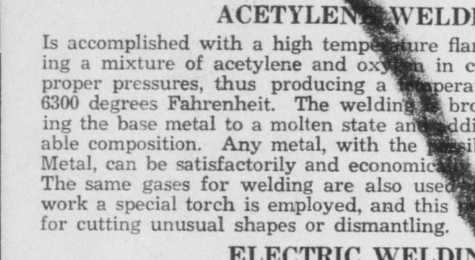
Spelling Bee March 30

**WELDING**

**FORGE WELDING**  
Is the method of the blacksmith shop. The metal is heated in the forge to a plastic state and then hammered on the anvil. For certain classes of work this process is the most economical, but is limited to a very small percentage of welding today.



**ACETYLENE WELDING**

Is accomplished with a high temperature flame produced by igniting a mixture of acetylene and oxygen in correct proportions and proper pressures, thus producing a temperature of approximately 6300 degrees Fahrenheit. The welding is brought about by reducing the base metal to a molten state and adding a filler rod of suitable composition. Any metal, with the possible exception of White Metal, can be satisfactorily and economically welded by this process. The same gases for welding are also used for cutting. For this work a special torch is employed, and this process is most practical for cutting unusual shapes or dismantling.

**ELECTRIC WELDING**

In arc welding the pieces of metal to be welded are brought to the proper temperature at point of contact by the heat liberated at the arc terminals and in the arc stream, so that the metals are completely fused into each other, forming a single solid homogeneous mass, after it solidifies. This method is most popular in our shop, as it saves hours of labor—any break that can be made, can be welded without dismantling, and made stronger than the original.
