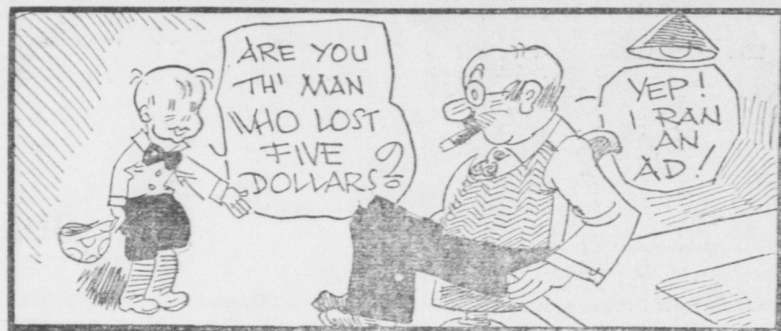

Foundations for Human Progress

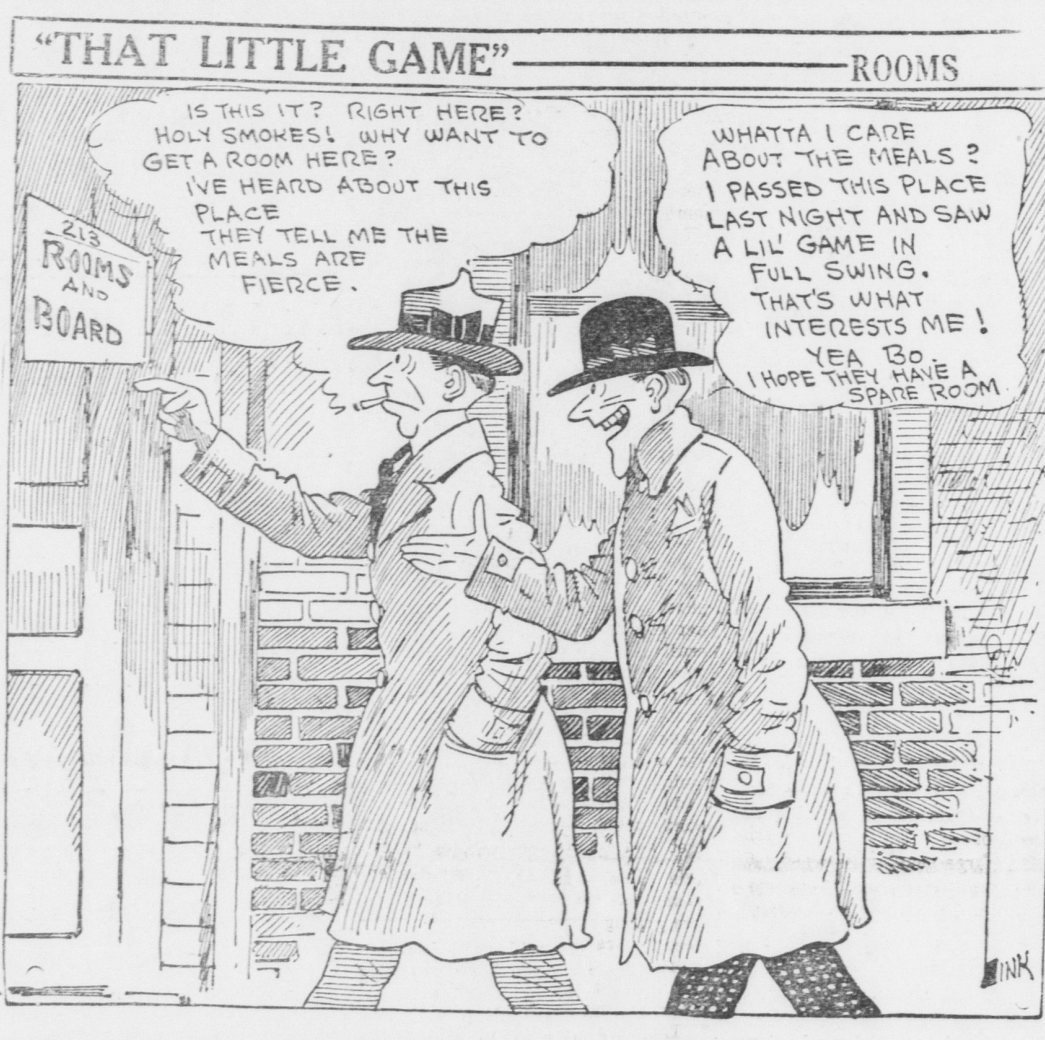
Human progress necessitates three foundations: a high standard of positive health; a reasonable share in reasonably distributed wealth, and a social system which gives to each the measure of reward he merits.
