

SEALED PROPOSALS will be received by the School Board of the School District of the Borough of Mt. If no bid is made, or if the plans and specifications are not returned to the Architect before opening of bids, the entire amount of deposit will be forfeited to the Architect.

Each bid shall be accompanied by either a certified check approved Surety Company's bid bond in amount of not less than two percent of amount of proposal, same to be drawn in favor of Joseph T. M. Breneman, Secretary of the School Board of the Borough of Mt. Joy, Pennsylvania.

The bidder agrees that the amount of the check or bid bond is the measure of liquidated damages which the Owner will sustain by his failure to execute the proper agreement and bonds, and if the bidder defaults in executing same within five days following award of contract, then the check or bid bond shall become the property of the Owner. Contractor will be required to furnish both a "Labor and Materialmen's Bond" and a "Performance Bond."

Work shall be started on the general contract not later than 3 days after the notification by the Owner to start work and on the remaining contracts as soon thereafter as the progress of the work in the building permits. The entire building shall be ready for occupancy on or before September 1, 1936. The provisions of the foregoing will be covered by a liquidated damage clause.

while Page, an undertaker from Williamsport, was traveling in a hearse driven by Yoder from Philadelphia to Williamsport. Near Elizabethtown the hearse was struck by Kegels' machine traveling east, and a few minutes later Kegels and Somer collided.

Page, the chief witness, testified that the hearse was going up a hill Kegels came over the crest in the middle of the road. Yoder, he said, drove the hearse off the concrete to the right of the highway but Kegels collided with them and then went on about a hundred feet before stopping.

A minute or so later, Page testified, Somer came over the hill and collided with Kegels' disabled machine which was standing across the road. Yoder was injured in the collision between the hearse and Kegels' machine, he stated.

The trial of the case was halted for some time yesterday morning when Paul A. Mueller, council for Somer, objected to the introduction into the case of the records of two cases previously tried when Kegels sued Somer. In those actions, Kegels was awarded \$100 for injuries, and his wife, Mrs. Edna M. Kegels, was awarded \$400 damages to her machine.

John A. Malone, attorney for Kegels, informed the Court that he admitted Page and Yoder were entitled to the amount of damages they sought, and asked for the admission of the records of the other two cases. Mueller refused to agree on this, declaring he had the legal right to have the cases tried in the regular manner.

Arthur J. Barber, of Pittsburgh, a former State employe, was the only other witness. He said he was driving just ahead of the hearse and that Kegels, when he came over the crest of the hill, nearly struck his machine. He heard the crash of the two machines colliding and stopped, he stated.

The jury was given instructions by Judge Schaeffer that they should return verdicts for the two plaintiffs and stated the amounts they should award. When the jury returned from an hour's deliberation, they rendered verdicts in favor of Page and Yoder but did not state any amounts.

Malone objected on the grounds that the jury disregarded the Court's instructions and another quarter of an hour was devoted to argument. Judge Schaeffer's charge was read to the jury and they retired again, returning in a few minutes with the verdicts.

It was indicated by attorneys that the cases will be taken into Argument Court for a decision on the question of whether the suits which Kegels brought against Somer should have any bearing on the two suits brought by Page and Yoder against both county men.

The jury was given instructions by Judge Schaeffer that they should return verdicts for the two plaintiffs and stated the amounts they should award. When the jury returned from an hour's deliberation, they rendered verdicts in favor of Page and Yoder but did not state any amounts.

Malone objected on the grounds that the jury disregarded the Court's instructions and another quarter of an hour was devoted to argument. Judge Schaeffer's charge was read to the jury and they retired again, returning in a few minutes with the verdicts.

It was indicated by attorneys that the cases will be taken into Argument Court for a decision on the question of whether the suits which Kegels brought against Somer should have any bearing on the two suits brought by Page and Yoder against both county men.
