
Try This Household Hint Test

Crunchy Drop Cookies 1 1/3 cups sifted flour; 3 tea-spoons double-acting baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 3 cups cereal flakes; 1 cup butter or other shortening: 1 cup granulated sugar; ½ cup brown sugar, firmly packed; 2 eggs, unbeaten; 1 teaspoon vanilla; 1½ cups shredded coconut. Sift flour once, measure, add-baking powder and salt, and sift again; add flakes. Cream butter, add sugar gradually, creaming thoroughly. Add eggs, one at a tion. Add vanilla. Add flour and flakes mixture, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition. Add coconut. Drop from teaspoon on ungreased baking sheet and bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 12 to 15 minutes, or until done. Makes about 5 dozen cookies. For




