LIKE FROG LEGS FOLKS: WILL BE RIPE JULY 1

Frog legs, perhaps the greatest delicacy offered by the inland waters, should grace many family tables this year in Pennsylvania following opening of the season on July 1.

Bullfrogs are to be found on most warm water and some trout streams. While much of their food consists of insect life along the streams a big frog will strike and swallow any moving creature of not too great a size.

They may be legally taken in the daytime by shooting, fishing with a treble hook draped with red flannel or similar methods. Use of an artificial light or spearing is forbidden.

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ROSES IN BLOOM ALONG BANKS OF STATE HIGHWAYS

Harrisburg, June 25—Thousands of roses are in full bloom in roadside plantings along more than 50 miles of Pennsylvania highways.

These plantings, planned by the Forestry Unit of the Department of Highways and placed by the Department in cooperation with local civic groups, are designed to express some salient point of community history.

This special attention is characteristic of all roadside plantings and Department experts search historical data in an attempt to select flowers or shrubs connected in some intimate manner with the community in which they will be placed.

Best known of the rose plantings are those along the Lincoln Highway in Adams, York and Lancaster counties.

Near Gettysburg, both along the Lincoln Highway toward the Maryland line, Memorial Roses—a delicate pink variety known to botanists as Wichuriana—bloom in commemoration of the Battle of Gettysburg.

In York and Lancaster counties, white and red roses respectively, commemorate the historic background of these counties which derive their names from two famous houses of fifteenth century England—the House of York and the House of Lancaster.

Students of history will recall these houses as rivals for control of the British throne during the bitter thirty-year conflict known as the War of the Roses, in which contestants adopted as their talismans, badges decorated with a white rose for the House of York, and a red rose for the House of Lancaster.

Today thousands of roses—white and red—line the Lincoln Highway in these counties enhancing the beauty of the roadside and reminding travelers of the flowers' historical significance.

Sales in the United States in March, 1936 totaled 272,139 compared with 213,464 in March of last year. Total sales for the first three months of this year were 570,959, compared with 432,415 in the same period in 1935.
