Solicitor John A. Coyle informed council that in the future the Boro must obtain a permit to open any portion of a state highway within the boro limits.
Upon motion council decided to purchase a plot of ground on West Donegal street from the Conestoga Transportation Company as offered by local realtor John E. Schroll. This will be done by ordinance and the solicitor will be instructed to prepare same and search the title.
Upon motion \$800 was transferred from the boro to the new bond interest account and \$300 from the boro to the water account.
All the bills were then paid and council adjourned.
