Christmas Cookies

Dear Club Members:
GET your fancy cookie cutters out and line up your sugar and spices, for it is time to make cookies for Christmas. Three weeks before Christmas is not too early to bake them. Christmas cookies all over the world are cut into shapes symbolic of Christmas. In Italy the cookies are cut into star shapes or made to look



like doves. In Sweden, cookies are made to look like elves. In France cookies are cut in the shape of "sabots" or wooden shoes. For holiday snacks with a glass of milk they are good in any country.

Hard Pepper Cookies from Sweden

1 1/2 cups cooking 2 teaspoons cinnamon
1 cup sugar 4 teaspoons baking powder
2 teaspoons ginger 2 eggs
1/2 cup shortening 5 cups flour

Cook the sugar and syrup until the sugar is liquid. Let it cool. Beat into it the eggs, cloves and other spices, the baking powder sifted, half the flour. Mix the other half of the flour with the shortening and fold into the syrup dough. Roll out moderately thin, adding more flour if necessary. Cut into star, elf, animal shapes, etc. Almonds are used for eyes, buttons, etc. Bake on greased cookie sheet in moderate oven (350° F.) about 20 minutes.

Almond Croissants from France

1 cup flour Pinch of salt
1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup sugar
1/4 cup shortening 1/2 cup sugar
1 egg yolk 2 tablespoons milk

Cream sugar and shortening, add egg yolk and dry ingredients and only a little milk to form stiff dough. Knead well, roll to desired thickness, cut with bird cookie cutter. Mark eyes with caraway seeds or currants and bake until a pale golden color.

Almond Croissants from France

1/2 cup shortening Pinch of salt
1 cup flour 1/2 cup sugar
1/4 cup pulverized almonds White of egg

Mix shortening and sugar, add egg yolks, beat well and then sift in slowly the flour and salt. Finally add the almonds, which should be as usually powdered as you can make them. Roll to 1/4 inch thickness. Add more flour if necessary to make it roll out smoothly. Cut with small crescent shaped cutters. Brush with egg white, sprinkle with chopped almonds and bake in moderate oven until golden brown.
