The firemen were the guests of the Rohrerstown Fire Company, and Rev. Burt A. Behrens gave the address of welcome. The invocation was offered by Chaplain W. R. Knerr.

In speaking for the Fire Chiefs' Association and as chairman of the Fire Prevention Committee, Earl F. Lefever proposed a contest to stimulate the building of water supplies in the county. The Fire Fighting and Fire Prevention committees and five fire chiefs were appointed to work out a plan to interest citizens in the county in the erection of cisterns for fire fighting purposes. The fire chiefs named on the committee were: Paul Z. Knier, Emory P. Wagner, John McCarthy, Lester Hirst, Noah Groff.

Lefever also called attention to a communication received from one of the largest insurance companies in the county in which it was pointed out rates could be reduced from 50 to 80 per cent by the installation of sprinkler systems in school buildings. Lefever said in part: "You firemen will be performing a worth while service by contacting your school boards and pointing out to them a sprinkler system will give 24 hour protection and a reduction in insurance rates that will pay for the installation in a comparatively short time and after that a dividend. Is there any better investment you can ask them to make of public funds?"

Chief Edward Shoemaker, of the Lancaster City Fire Department, called attention to inquiries being made to store fireworks throughout the County. "In many communities an ordinance will prevent this, and before you rent a building for such storage bear in mind your insurance rates will jump 500 percent as well as the rates on adjoining buildings," he stated.

Twenty-four fires, with a damage of \$10,131, were reported by Fire Marshall Knier. Four hundred and four men, representing 31 companies, responded to the alarms and saved property valued at \$43,935.

Ivan Mowery, of New Holland, was appointed chairman of the Law & Legislation Committee to fill the unexpired term of the late J. D. Rider.

It was announced by George F. Weidner, chairman of the Memorial Committee, the annual memorial services will be held in Manheim May 30.

## NEW HIGHWAY MAP WAS ISSUED BY STATE DEPT.

The state highway department Saturday released a new road map for the use of Pennsylvania motorists. The map contains new route numbers for several roads in the southeastern section of Pennsylvania.

The changes include: Lakes-to-sea highway between West Chester and Harrisburg will be changed from State Route 5 to U. S. 322. State Route 796 between the State line and Russellville will be

changed to State Route 896 running into Lancaster.

State Route 572 will be extended from Parkesburg into Atglen. State Route 340 will run from Coatesville to Lancaster, paralleling the Lincoln highway, U. S. 30, to the north.
