P. U. C. OFFICIALS WILL EXPLAIN NEW TRUCKING ACT

All of this week and next week (Aug. 16 to 27 inclusive) representatives of the Public Utility Commission will interview truck and bus operators in the Office of the County Controller in the Court House at Lancaster, Pa.

This new Act requires that all operators carrying property or persons for compensation in Pennsylvania, come under the jurisdiction and must have the approval of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

Your truck and bus operating problem can be discussed with these men, and applications for Permits covering your type of service can be obtained.

Penalties can be imposed for operating without the proper Permit or Certificate, and it is suggested that Operators avail themselves of the opportunity to secure this information while it is so conveniently available.
