Secretary of Revenue J. Griffith Broadman ruled that fog lamps may be used either alone or in connection with regular head lamps during adverse weather.

The ruling came in response to inquiries from motorists and official motor vehicle inspection stations who wanted to know if it is necessary to use headlamps when the fog lamps are being used.

Broadman pointed out, however, that better results are obtained from the use of the fog lamps alone when driving in fog, rain or snow. The use of fog lamps in clear weather is discouraged. When either fog lamps Shwilkey Bumblesock or headlamps or both are used, the rear lamp must also be lighted.
