Rural Air Mail Service Thru Here

Rural air mail service between Philadelphia and Pittsburg, with deliveries and pickup at 24 communities including Lancaster, Columbia, West Chester and Coatesville, will be instituted shortly as one of four "rural" non-stop routes planned as experiments by the Post Office Department.

A request in Washington yesterday for bids on the four proposed routes disclosed the plans for the new service, which will revolutionize U. S. Air Mail service if expanded generally.

Just how the mail will be picked up and delivered while in flight will be left to the discretion of the airlines, provided only that the plan is approved by the Bureau of Air Commerce. Invitations for bids, which will be opened on Sept. 15, were sent to all air lines.
