Eskimos Live in Frame

Houses; Igloos Are Gone Seattle.—Eskimos must be dissociated from igloos, for there is not one in use today, at least in Alaska, said Leonard Berline, United States surveyor, returned from a long season in the Far North.

The natives now live in frame houses, or "barbaras," he said. A "barbara" is built half underground, half above ground and covered with grass, boards or anything to keep the elements out. When built underground it oftentimes is necessary to build fires to thaw out the ground. They are not the best abodes in the world, Berline said, but Eskimos are a good-natured and care-free band of people and make the best of it.
