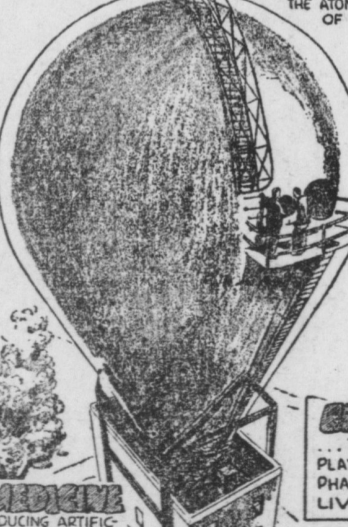

HOSPITAL PATIENTS

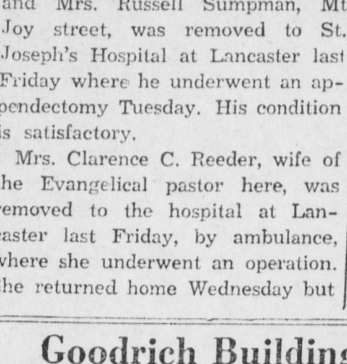
