Isaac Earhart

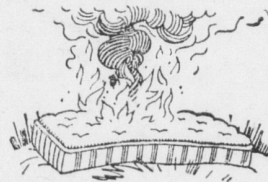

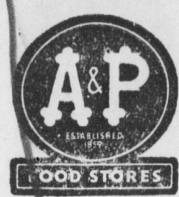

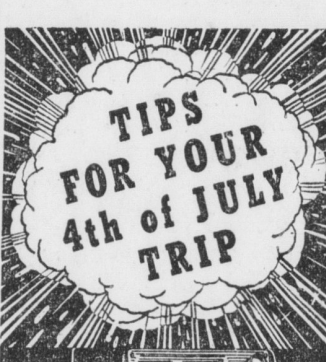
