Two periods of resting or sleepng in a "berth" may be cumulated to give a total of eight hours off bunk on a truck which is properly equipped for sleeping, including spring mattress, pillow, adequate ord clothing, adequate ventilation, and ready means of entering or on their scales.

No carrier subject to the regulations if himself a driver shall remain on duty or drive for longer periods than prescribed by the reg-

The regulations do not apply to any carrier when engaged in transporting property to or from any section of the state with the object of providing relief in case of earthquake, flood, fire, famine, drought, state-controlled stores.
