An apple pie baking contest held in the afternoon was won by Doris Leedom with Ruth Rensel taking second.

Esther Nissley was named grand champion of the exhibit at the intermission of the evening program and was presented with a large ribbon and a cash prize. She was awarded ten ribbons for exhibits in the fair and received eighteen points. Others to receive grand championship awards were John Miller and Wilmer Heisey with sixteen points and Jay Reich with fifteen points. The latter winners had received eight and seven ribbons during the fair.

Winners of the poultry judging contest were also announced at the evening program. George Endslow of the junior class received first prize with 159 points, Frank Kipp, second with 138 points and Nathan Kendig, third with 136 points. The winners were announced by S. F. Simmons, agriculture instructor at the school.

Two log sawing contests in the afternoon attracted much attention. In the junior high school division the team of Lloyd Stoner and Raymond Sumpman sawed a twelve-inch ash log through in thirty-five seconds. In the senior high school division it took the team of Lester Roland and Nathan Kendig 37.8 seconds to do the same feat.

Other winners in the junior high contest were M. Riedorf and Ivan Wolgemuth, second and Frank Kipp and Kenneth Kipp, third. In the senior high contest Robert Hershey and Clayton White finished second and Clarence Brubaker and John Miller placed third. The contest was in charge of Norman Kolp.

Athletic contests in softball, soccer and hockey with contestants from Maytown and surrounding territory featured the day's program. John Hart, physical director for boys, and Miss Mary Strickler, physical director for girls, were in charge of these contests.

Results of the athletic contests featured on the program of the East Donegal Fair Friday were as follows:

Soccer: eighth defeated seventh, 2-0; ninth defeated eighth, 2-1; eleventh defeated ninth, 1-0; eleventh defeated twelfth 3-0 to become champions of the school.

Girls' hockey: twelfth defeated tenth, 1-0; and twelfth defeated eleventh 1-0 to become champions. Girls junior high softball: ninth defeated eighth 17-10.

Eoy's junior high softball: eighth defeated seventh 22-13. Softball: Maytown Elementary defeated Florin Elementary 24-11.
