Illustrated Lecture On Hybrid Corn

A free illustrated lecture on the production of hybrid seed corn will be presented next Friday night, November 17, in the Mount Joy Borough High School auditorium, here. The program starts at 7:30 o'clock, and is sponsored by Mr. Elmer F. Groff, of Rheems, Pa., local representative for the Pioneer Hi-Bred Corn Company.

The program includes a short talk on hybrid corn, an informal question and answer discussion, and an educational film which illustrates exactly how inbreeding of corn is carried on, how crosses are produced from the inbreds, how hybrids are performance tested, how hybrid seed fields are detasseled, and how hybrid seed is processed after it is picked in early fall. Processing corn ear-by-ear, sorting of seed, artificial drying, shelling, grading of seed into several kernel sizes, treating with mercury dust, and testing for germination.

The education film clearly illustrates the many advantages corn growers derive by planting superior hybrid seed corn. Scenes of cornfields where hybrids are planted side by side with open-pollinated corn are shown. Scenes which prove the overwhelming superiority of good hybrids over open-pollinated strains. Two free half bushels of Pioneer hybrid seed corn will be given away at attendance awards.

The Pioneer Hi-Bred Corn Company, Des Moines, Iowa was the first commercial producer of hybrid seed corn, beginning its hybrid corn breeding program in 1913 and distributing its first hybrid seed on the market in 1924.

Pioneer corn breeders extend their corn breeding operations from the western edges of the corn country clear across the cornbelt to Pennsylvania and Virginia. Their eastern cornbelt breeding plot is located at Herndon, Virginia, on the banks of the Potomac, about 60 miles directly south of the York County, Pennsylvania, border. Here, Pioneer corn breeders are at work producing inbreds and making experimental hybrid crosses from selected open pollinated varieties grown in Pennsylvania and other eastern states.

Corn breeding activities for Pioneer hybrids are carried on in four large breeding stations and hundreds of preference testing plots which dot every corner of the cornbelt. Fifteen processing plants situated in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio, process Pioneer hybrid seed corn in the fall starting usually about the middle of September and continuing into the early winter months.

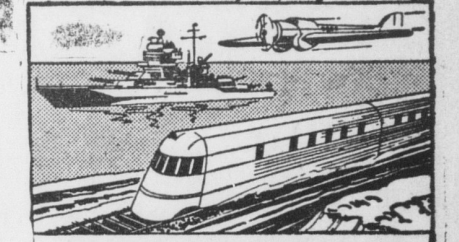
