Miss Margaret Buchan, of the Spry Research Kitchen, conducted the second session of Cooking with Confidence at Joy Theatre, on Tuesday, with two hundred eighty seven adults in attendance.

The increase in attendance was sufficient proof of the great interest created by the first session of the Cooking School held one week ago.

Miss Buchan directed Tuesday's School under quite painful circumstances caused by an injury to her left foot.

This, however did not deter her in again gaining the full interest of every person in the audience from the very beginning.

This program revealed many easy, attractive and delicious recipes that included corn sticks, frosted spice cake with java raisin frosting, tart shells filled with vanilla, chocolate and butterscotch filling topped with nut meats and whipped cream; macaroni cheese cutlets, chocolate pecan wafers, and Aunt Jenny's favorite dinner, Spry baked potatoes with savory beef.

Miss Buchan gave housewives very useful hints when she suggested that: when using cake flour in a recipe, you beat it into the other ingredients, but when using an all-purpose flour you stir it in to obtain the best results; heating muffin tins in the oven before dropping in the batter, this causes the muffins to get an even golden brown over the entire surface. Many other sugges-

tions so important to the success of a "dish" are learned throughout the program, which proves that the Cooking School is quite instructive and not only a ladies matinee.

The third and final session will be held on Tuesday, January 23rd, at 2 P. M.
