INCREASING THE BONDED IN-DEBTEDNESS OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY IN THE SUM OF TO FINANCE THE BOROUGH'S SHARE OF A FED-ERAL W.P.A. PROJECT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF ALTERA-TIONS AND ADDITIONS TO THE BOROUGH HALL: PROVIDING FOR THE FORM OF BONDS AND COUPONS, AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN BOROUGH OFFICIALS LEVYING A TAX SUFFICIENT STATE TAX THEREUPON, TO- Mount Joy Borough, deceased.

Section 1. The bonded indebtedness of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., is hereby increased in the sum of Ten Thous and Dollars (\$10,000.00), for the purpose of providing funds for or toward this Borough's share of the cost of a Federal Works Progress Administration project for the con-struction of alterations and additions to the Borough Hall.

Section 2. Said indebtedness shall be evidenced by twenty cou-Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each, dated the first day of November, A. D. 1940, and bearing two and one-fourth (21/4%) per on the first day of the months of May and November of Pa each year during the life of said bonds, which shall mature and be paid in their numerical order at Willis G. Kendig, rate of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) on the first day of November of each and every year from November 1, 1941 to Novem-

ber 1, 1960, both years inclusive. Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable without deduction for any taxes, exinheritance taxes, which may be levied or assessed thereon under any present or future law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, all of delay for settlement to the under-which taxes the Borough of Mount signed, residing at R. Bonds numbered from 12 to 20 inclusive, shall, at the option of this Borough, be subject to renption at par prior to maturity either as a whole, or, from time t time, in part, on November 1, 1951 or any interest-paying date there after, upon notice thereof published once in one newspaper published in the Borough of Mount Joy, Pa., at least thirty days before such redemption date/s.

Section 3. The said bonds and pared by the Borough Solicitors and such form, so prepared (as certified by the Borough officers hereinafter authorized to execute bonds) is hereby approved and ratified.

Section 4. The President of Borough Council is hereby directed to execute said bonds on behalf of the Borough of Mount Joy and the Borough Secretary to affix thereto the corporate seal of the Borough of Mount Joy and to attest the same; and the Borough Treasurer is hereby directed to cause the coupons attached to said bonds to be signed on behalf of the Borough of Mount Joy with his engraved or printed facsimile signature.
