Further plans will be announced later.

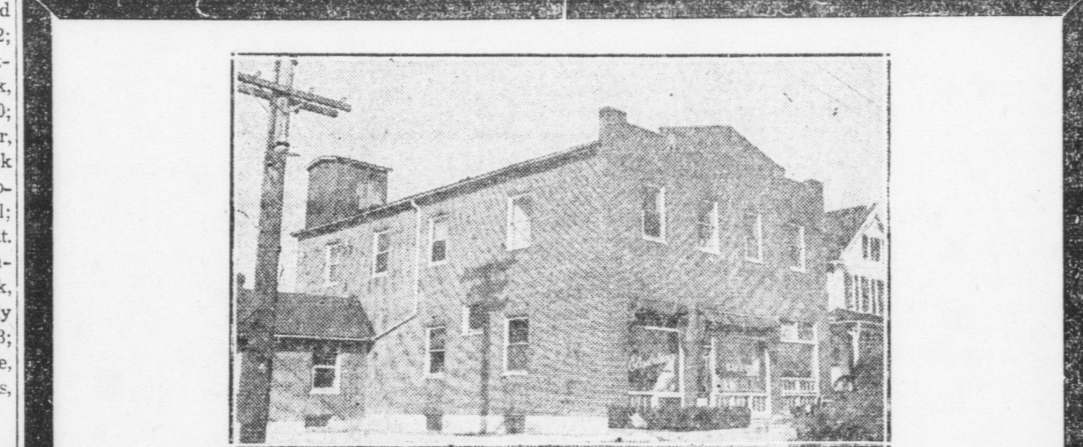
