SOW ADAPTED OATS

Farmers will find that adapted oats varieties will produce better than oats from unproven sources. Agronomists of the Pennsylvania State College report that Patterson and Cornelian are good varieties for Pennsylvania conditions as proved in extension demonstrations and by experience of farmers.

Present indications are that hog slaughter will be reduced materially in the first quarter of 1941, according to the U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics.
