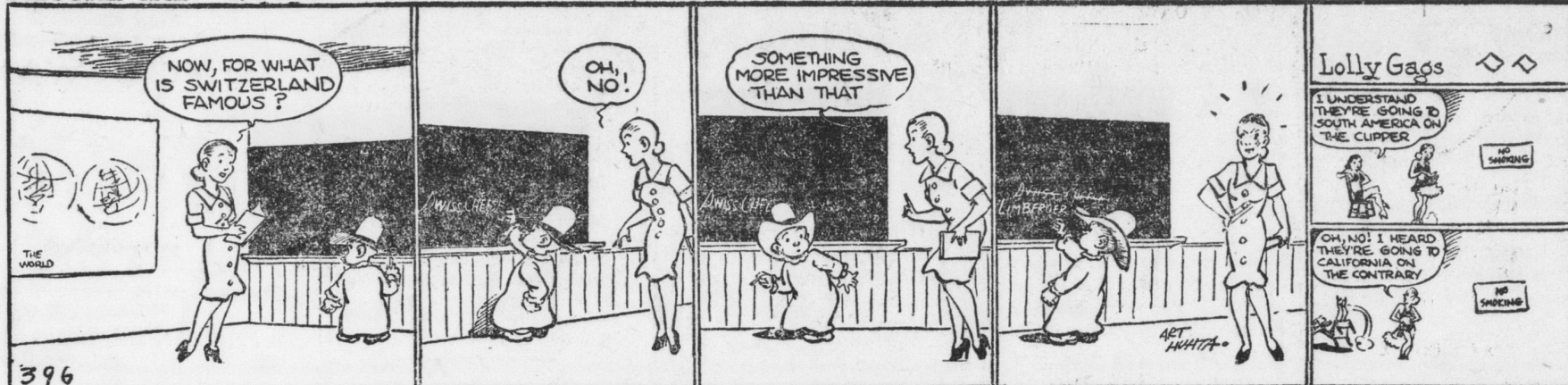
Nine little doggies Sizzling on the plate, In came the soldiers - Then they were ate.

New Industry

(From Page 1) The Nissly-Swiss Chocolate Co. at Florin. It was leased from the owners, the Lancaster Shoe Company, for a period of years with the privilege of purchase. The building has four floors of 21,000 square feet and was recently put in A1 condition contemplating a tenant.

The Firm
The Tidy Products Corporation came to Columbia exactly four years ago, employing about fifty people. Today they occupy 37,000 square feet of floor space there, employ 210 people and during busy seasons about 260. The firm manufactures sleeping garments, bath robes and snow suits of the better grades and styles for infants and children and sells its products to 4,000 customers thruout the United States.

Will Open Friday
Several weeks ago an advertisement for help was inserted in The BULLETIN with the understanding that if the firm could get about 40 or 50 experienced sewing machine operators, our town would be considered as a location. More than that number applied for positions.

The new plant will open Friday of this week and if at all possible will start with forty employees. They expect to have seventy-five the pay roll by May 15th.

No Piece Working
The firm operates steadily thruout the year and all employees work by the week. The minimum female wage is 35 cents an hour and male wage is 40 cents. All regular employees are given seven legal holidays on which the factory does not operate, with pay each year.

No Foreign Help
The management informs us that only local help will be employed. Only three supervising floorladies will be brought here to instruct the operators.

Pay Weekly
All employees will be paid weekly on Friday morning. Their pay will include Thursday's work, no time being held back as is the custom at many plants.

No Financial Aid
We are pleased to say that this plant is locating in our community without any financial aid whatever, at no time soliciting anything such as free water, taxes, rent, etc. usually asked for by new industries.

The Firm's History
The writer visited the Tidy Products plant at Columbia Tuesday and was pleased with the clean and neat working conditions. While there we learned that during the four years at Columbia, their plant was not closed one day.

It has paid Christmas bonuses to all its employees each year, although this is not guaranteed.

The firm holds an annual picnic, usually the first week in August, for all its employees at which time the husbands and children of the workers are invited. Last year 700 attended the picnic at Rocky Springs at which time the firm supplied refreshments, starting the day's festivities with a corn roast. The children were supplied with amusement tickets.

It is also customary for the firm to hold a Thanksgiving Dance on Thanksgiving Eve for all employees and their mates. At this time a buffet supper is served.

The Management
The Tidy Products Corporation has a business office at 135 West 136th Street, New York City.

Mr. Jack Trilling is general manager of the plant at Columbia and will also have charge of the branch here.

We welcome this new industry to our midst and wish it unlimited success.

(From Page 1) rabbit out of a gutter when he slipped and fell, his gun was accidentally discharged as it struck the ground. He testified it was sleeting at the time and the weather conditions were responsible for the accident.

Simon Shearer Case
Simon F. Shearer, fifty-two, Mt. Joy, R. D. 2, was absolved of all blame by the referee in the hunting accident in which Walter T. Becker, thirty-four, a neighbor, was wounded on November 1. Becker testified a single pellet penetrated his upper right leg. Shearer said they were hunting a pheasant which they had spotted on their land earlier and that he did not see Becker before he fired at the bird.

Edward Nissley Case
Shaffer reserved his decision for ten days in the cases of Edward Nissley, fifty-two, 535 Locust St., Columbia, and Harry D. Shenk, thirty-eight, 353 East Chestnut Street. Nissley, who admitted figuring in two previous hunting accidents, accidentally shot his nephew, Raymond Nissley, eighteen, Columbia, R. D. 1, in the left leg while they were hunting at the latter's home November 4. Shenk accidentally wounded Claude A. Mowrer, thirty-five, Lancaster R. D. 6, in both legs while gunning near Gettysburg.

Russell Yingt Case
Russell Yingt, Mannheim failed to appear for a hearing. He was cited in the accident in which Harold Romberger, Mannheim R. D. 2, was shot in the leg on November 22. The accident occurred while Yingt was putting a pheasant in his hunting coat, his hand accidentally jarring the gun and causing it to be discharged. Yingt will be given five days to furnish reasons to the State why he was unable to be present.
