## Fires Are Preventable, Expert Asserts.

Loss from rural fires averages \$400 every minute of the day, a loss the village home owner or farmer might reduce by his own efforts.

The farmer in particular, he points out, must be his own building inspector, zoning officer and in an emergency his own fireman and fire chief. If he does a good job in each case, he can do much toward reducing an annual rural fire loss of about \$225,000,000.

When possible, farm buildings should be in line at right angles to prevailing winds. With this arrangement there is less danger of sparks being carried from one building to another. Roofs of major buildings should be of fire resistant material. Chimneys may be cleaned of soot using a few bricks or rocks in a sack at the end of a long rope. Furnaces, stoves, and stove pipes properly installed and inspected regularly reduce a common cause of fire.

A system of grounded conductors gives protection against lightning. Carelessness in handling lamps and lanterns, in disposing of ashes, in storing and handling gasoline and kerosene and in allowing rubbish to accumulate where it becomes a fire hazard accounts for many farm fires.

The U. S. Engineers report that many serious rural fires have been avoided because ladders were at hand and water or fire extinguishers were readily available. This is a safety measure that is always highly desirable.

### HOW TO DETECT COUNTERFEIT BILLS

1. KNOW YOUR MONEY!
2. COMPARE the suspected bill with a genuine one of the same type and denomination. Observe carefully the following features:
  - (a) PORTRAIT: Genuine is lifelike; stands out from oval which is a fine screen of regular lines; notice particularly if counterfeit is dull, smudged, or unnaturally white; scratches are dark with irregular and broken lines.
  - (b) SEAL: On genuine, sawtooth points around rim are identical; on counterfeit, sawtooth points are usually different; unevenly printed; same color as seal. Counterfeit, style different; printed; uneven in appearance.
  - (c) SERIAL NUMBERS: Genuine have distinctive style; printed; same color as seal. Counterfeit, style different; printed; uneven in appearance.
  - (d) PAPER: Genuine bills are printed on distinctive paper, small red and blue silk threads.
3. RUBBING a bill will NOT prove whether it is counterfeit; ink will rub off of either.
4. REMEMBER—NOT ALL STRANGERS ARE COUNTERFEITERS, BUT ALL COUNTERFEITERS ARE LIKE STRANGERS.

### TYPES OF CURRENCY

The only three types of currency printed by the Government for circulation are:

1. FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES, which bear GREEN serial numbers.
2. UNITED STATES NOTES, which bear RED serial numbers.
3. SILVER CERTIFICATES, which bear BLUE serial numbers.

WASHINGTON	on all	\$1.00 bills
JEFFERSON	on all	\$2.00 bills
LINCOLN	on all	\$5.00 bills
HAMILTON	on all	\$10.00 bills

GRANT	on all	\$50.00 bills
FRANKLIN	on all	\$100.00 bills
