CONCRETE sidewalks or flagstone paths can be laid directly on the

earth granting natural drainage fa-cilities and soil sufficiently loose to assure moisture filtration. When adequate drainage is lacking, the installation of a well-packed base of at least six inches of gravel or cinders is essential to prevent the collection of water from undermin-

Whatever the path width or flagstone design, two by fours laid so as the top edges mark the walk surface make convenient side and section foot sections with narrow vacancies to allow for expansion. The irregular designs commonly emphasized in concrete flagstone construction ade-

Pour the concrete in alternating sections, and when hardened, remove the cross boards before filling remaining areas.

Level off each section before dry-

ing with a board pressed hard against the side forms to remove surplus Each block is best tooled or spotted slightly to prevent slipping on the otherwise smooth surface. Q.-Suggest a method for painting

canvas covered pipes. Is a special primer necessary? What paint do you recommend? A.—No special paint or method of application is required for decorating canvas surfaces. Merely apply three coats of good quality flat paint, the like of which is specified for wall

board and plaster. For complete assurance as to the quality of the ingredients and consequent durability, it is advisable to mix the priming coat on the job from 3 parts (by volume) of paste white lead, 4 parts lead mixing or lead reducing oil Follow with two topcoats of equal parts of the two ingredients tinted as desired with paste colors-in-oil
