

economics to farm boys and girls from 10 to 20 years of age through letters, meetings, talks, pictures, and practical demonstrations. This work is conducted through the County Agent's office by The Pennsylvania State College with the United States Department of Agriculture cooperating. The four H's stand for Head' Heart, Hand, and Health. The work is carried on by clubs in the different communities with a volunteer local leader in charge. In the county there are 66 Local Leaders supervising the 4-H Club Program. Farm girls interested in learning more about Home Economics may enroll for, foods, canning, baking, clothing, and room improvement projects. Boys and girls interested in agriculture may enroll in pig feeding, lamb feeding, capon raising, chick rearing, dairy calf, corn, tobacco, potatoes home garden,

or vegetable production projects. Nearly all of the above projects are very important to produce food for our country. Any farm boy or girl interested in joining any of these projects or in getting further information should contact either the nearest Local Leader or M. M. Smith, 202 P. O. Euilding, Lancaster.
