### RAVISHER OF GIRL SEEKS NEW TRIAL

Six reasons were set forth in a motion for a new trial filed in behalf of Charles T. Kuhn, thirty-four, Elizabethtown R3, father of five children, who was convicted at the September term of assault with intent to ravish.  
 Kuhn was arrested by State Police on the complaint of a 19-year-old Newville girl, who was attacked near Elizabethtown, on the night of June 20. In finding Kuhn guilty, the jury recommended him to the mercy of the Court. Four of the six reasons for new trial filed by George T. Hambright, Kuhn's attorney, were exceptions taken to the charge of Judge Schaeffer to the jury.

 in part: "I understand the Navy Department has released news that we've had a time of it here for a while. Most of my clothes are riddled with shrapnel, but I'm damned happy to say that I'm not."  
 "The shelling and bombing as well as land action were quite severe, but I believe we've gotten them licked—for a while at least. Every man here has fought like a hero and the boys deserve a lot of praise."  
 "I am enclosing a bill (Japanese 10 yen bill) that you can spend when you get to Tokyo. The previous owner will have no further use for it—ever."  
 "Our morale is still high and we still feel we can whip them if the odds against us are kept down to 3 or 4 to 1."  
 Mrs. Kahn, who is staying with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. P. Frank Schock, in Mt. Joy says that his letters have come through regularly on the whole, since he sailed the first of June.  
 She recently returned from California, where she spent the summer and now expects to find a job, "to keep herself busy" until her husband comes home.
