BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY ORDINANCE: Providing for the furnishing of electric service to the Borough of Mount Joy, County of Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

Whereas, there is now on file with the Borough Secretary, a form of agreement covering the supply of electric energy for the operation of the Borough's water pumping and filtering plant located approximately 5 miles north of the Borough of Mount Joy, on the west side of little Chiques Creek in Mount Joy Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Mount Joy and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

That the Borough of Mount Joy enter into an agreement with Pennsylvania Power & Light Company for the furnishing of all the electric energy required by the Borough for the operation of the Borough's said water pumping and filtering plant for the period and in accordance with the terms contained in the form of agreement now on file with the Borough Secretary for the furnishing of such service for a minimum period of one year, based on the Company's Tariff Schedule GLE 2 (March 1, 1941) and Rule 23; and that the proper officers of the Borough be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver said form of agreement on behalf of the Borough.

Enacted into an ordinance and passed by the Council of the Borough of Mount Joy this 30th day of August 1943.
