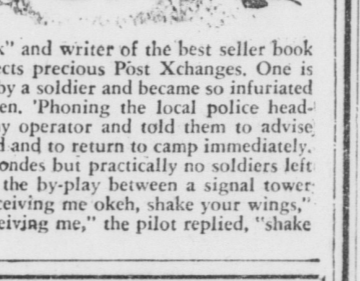
THE LOW DOWN FROM HICKORY GROVE

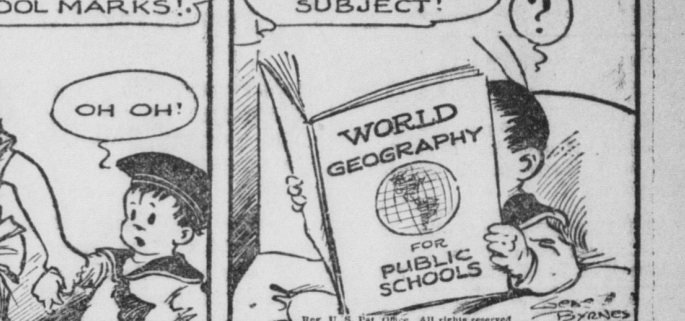
