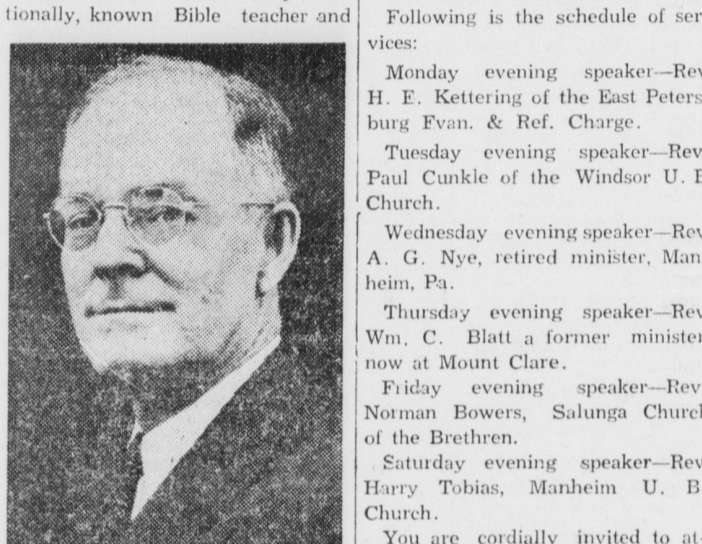

U.S. Asbestos Employes On WCAU Navy Prog.



Participating in the Navy "Salute to Industry" program over WCAU on Tuesday, February 15th, at 3:20 P. M., were Irwin Barto, Albert Dissinger, and Lester Walters. It was pointed out that the U. S. Asbestos Division, Manheim, Pa., is making brake-lining, clutch facings, gaskets, and packings for passenger cars, buses, trucks, and industrial equipment, and that a major part of the company's production is now going into vehicles of war—to jeeps and trucks and tanks, to insulation for turbines on Navy ships, and highly specialized gaskets for use in air-intake on exhaust manifold of heavy bombers.
