Hot-caps are miniature greenhouses placed over separate plants or hills of vegetables. Plant protectors of this sort cost two cents or more, depending on size, and are made of translucent, water-resistant paper that lets the sunlight through warm the plants. On sunny days the temperature inside a hot-cap may be 10 degrees or 20 degrees above the temperature outside.

Fabric Storage

Textile specialists from the U.S. department of agriculture recently finished a four-year study of the effects of different kinds of storage on different fabrics. Cotton and wool kept at an attic temperature of about 102 degrees were weaker at the end of the test and both white cotton and white linen had turned yellow, indicating a chemical change. Linen did not suffer as much damage from stored in the dark suffered less than those stored in the light, which makes fabrics break down chemically and become weaker.
