If Mr. Farmer does not care to sell at the OPA ceiling, they will take his crop, pack it, and store it with the express purpose of selling it at the OPA's ceiling price on packed tobacco. They will deduct the expense of handling which would be cases, packing, shrinkage, etc., with the farmer getting the advance.

By this method the grower is guaranteed twenty-one cents at any time, the present OPA ceiling price with a possibility of getting several cents per pound additional thru the other channel. Furthermore, farmers can deliver their crop as soon as it is stripped, right now if it is ready.

The latter plan is precisely what the farmers organization aims to do but facing numerous objections, has many of them on the doubtful list while thru the packers' plan they get the benefit of packing experience, cases on hand, warehouses, and large volume sales, which naturally, are quite important.
