Pfc. Warren F. Reist, twenty-seven, attached to the 28th Division, was slightly wounded in France, on Dec. 24, the War Department notified his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. Clarence Reist, of Landisville.

Pfc. Reist entered the service in February, 1944, trained at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and arrived overseas in September, 1944. Prior to entering the service he was employed at the Hamilton Watch Co.

At an Air Force Service Command in Italy—Engaged in testing a radio set he has overhauled is Radio Mechanic Robert L. Randler of Mt. Joy, Penna. A graduate of the Signal Corps Radio School at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, Cpl. Randler is assigned for duty with the Radio Maintenance and Repair Section of an Air Force Signal Depot. Overseas for the past 11 months, Cpl. Randler has seen service with the Signal Corps in North Africa, Corsica, France, and Italy. Prior to his entry into the Armed Forces in February, 1943, he was employed by Gerberich Shoe Company of Mt. Joy. He was graduated from the Mt. Joy High School in 1941. Cpl. Randler's mother, Mrs. Carrie Randler, resides at 113 Columbia Ave., Mt. Joy. Mrs. Randler has 2 other sons serving overseas, Lester, who is with the 2nd Army in France, and Michael, serving with the Air Force in India.
