From Farm Crop Waste While there has been talk and exabout obtaining several by-products from corn stalks and other farm waste, the United States department of agriculture now comes out with a full-fledged program for extractcottonseed hulls and burs and sugarcane bagasse and other farm waste.

The department says that experimental laboratory investigations by their chemists indicate that from 90 to 95 gallons of liquid motor fuel can be obtained from a ton of corncobs or cottonseed hulls and that about half of this is in the form of ethyl

Experimentations have advanced to the semi-works stage at the D. of A. northern regional research laboratory at Peoria, Ill., and results to be enlarged so that it now may be evaluated on a semi-commercial scale.
