Mrs. Elmer R. Snyder, owner of the Snyder Orchards, Florin, has given permission to members of the Sportsmen's Club to close the orchards to hunters so that the grounds may be used as a private game propagation area, it was reported at the 102nd regular meeting of the club held Monday evening in the Fire House.

Game will be trapped in this area after the regular hunting season and liberated in other areas. A motion was passed to employ a man to patrol the game propagation area during the month of November to prevent hunting in the restricted zone.

Replies to letters sent by the sec. to various ammunition manufacturers concerning ammunition and targets for club members were read. The results were not favorable.

The Fish Committee reported 16,000 small-mouthed bass fingerlings stocked in Big Chiques Creek and at White Oak Dam.

The club members will have a display booth at the Mt. Joy Community Exhibit in Newcomer's Building this week.

Hunt Safety Week, October 22-29, sponsored by the State Game Commission, will be observed by the local club by having motion pictures shown to the local school children at assembly during that week.

Robert M. Greener, Lancaster County Fish Warden, will speak at the November meeting on stocking fish in Little Chiques Creek.

Eighty members renewed membership and 32 men were welcomed into the club membership.

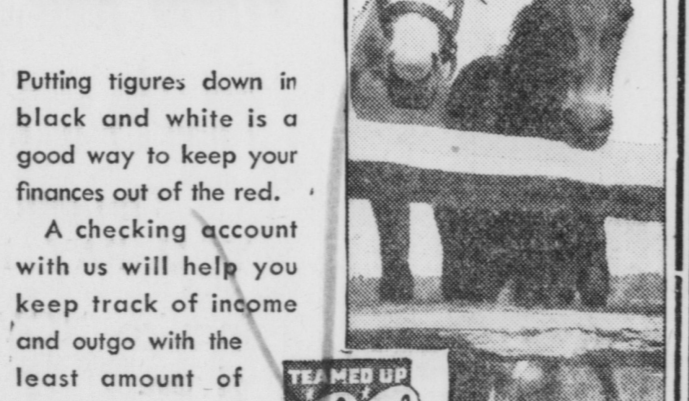

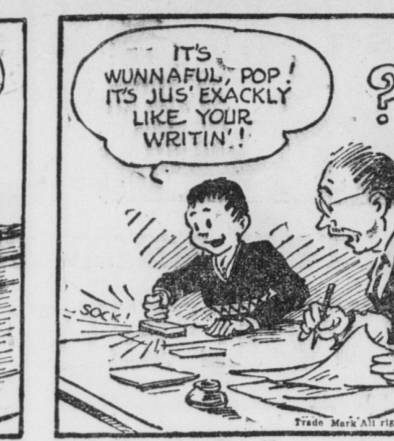
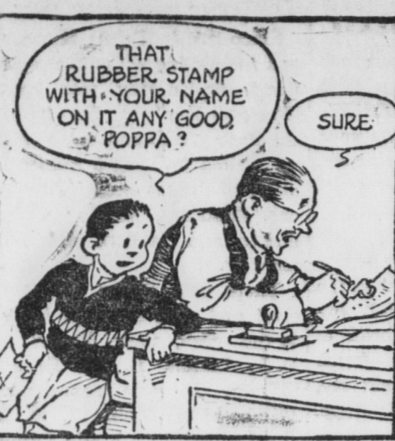

PROTECT POULTRY RANGES Heavy pasturing of the poultry range too late in the fall seriously damage the grass and legumes for next year. Poultry extension specialists of the Pennsylvania State College suggest that the mature pullets be housed so that the flock is gradually reduced, and wear on the range are diminished.

AVOID ACCIDENTS Corn pickers cause 10 per cent of all farm accidents in Pennsylvania, and during the last three months of the year they cause one-fifth to one-third of all farm accidents for that period. Extension agricultural engineers of the Pennsylvania State College say not to work around parts and to use shields.

START EROSION CONTROL With the planting of winter wheat, some fields can be laid out in strips on the contour. This will give a start on this important work and next spring other strips can be started, Penn State, extension agronomists point out.
