# **Facklers Were Given Hearing On Involuntary**

Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Fackler of this boro, were given a hearing on the charge of involuntary manslaughter in the death of their child. The case was heard before Alderman J. Edward Wetzel at Lancaster. Mrs. Fackler was released on her own recognizance and her husband on \$1,000 bail for appearance at the December term of criminal court

Unrepresented by attorney, the mother of eight other children told Assistant Attorney John W. Beyer that a man taught her how to pow-wow 12 years ago and "when they told me the baby had the 'wastes', I thought I'd 'try for it' ... just like any other mother would

The couple appeared to answer charges preferred by County Detective Jacob Weller of "failure to supply medical aid or attention" to the child, Jane Louise Fackler. The malnutrition verdict was given by Dr. A. V. Walter county coroner who said the child weighed only nine pounds at death.
