The accused man, Myrl Dorwart, who lives alone in a house near the school was arrested by Dauphin Co. Detectives in the basement of the Bachman Chocolate Company, here, where he was employed. Held without bail of charges of rape and molesting school girls. Dowart was committed to the Dauphin County prison to await arrangement before Justice of the Peace Wilmer Brubaker, Conewago Township.

The girl Dorwart is accused o ravishing identified him as her assailant.

Dorwart was sentenced in 1934 by he Dauphin County Court to serve a five-to-ten-year sentence in the Eastern Penitentiary on a sodomy charge involving young girls.
