SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS WILL BE REWARDED

For faithful service during the past year members of the School Safety Patrols will be rewarded by the Lancaster Automobile Club, which sponsors the organization in more than 200 Lancaster city and county schools.

More than 1,200 of the 2,200 boys and girls who served on the Patrol during the 1945-46 term will receive embossed certificates, signed by the mayor of Lancaster, the president of the automobile club and the principal and patrol supervisor of the school.

In each Lancaster city school—public or parochial—and in the larger borough and township schools a medal will be given the Safety Patrol member selected by the school for outstanding service during the year.

According to a recent survey, Safety Patrols are operating in 215 Lancaster city and county schools, including more than 100 one-room and two-room rural schools. These are sponsored and equipped by the automobile club, with the co-operation of State and local police and the school authorities.
