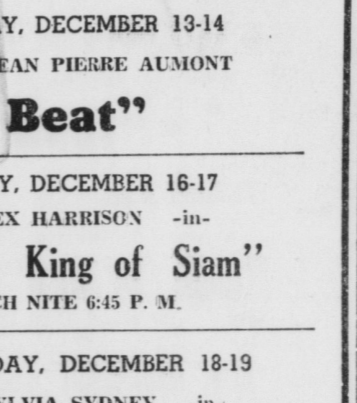
George—republican or democrat—it would cut no ice or make way from fummiddles. Gold has a difference. Folks want to get a clink and jingle to it that oozes confidence.
