Both of these classes comprise what is known as heavy wrapper tobacco among growers and does not mean fillers or second grade tobacco.

An exhibit in any class shall consist of 15 leaves with an additional leaf as a tier. The leaves in any exhibit should be uniform in color, length, thickness etc. and be free from blemishes.

No entries will be accepted after 1:30 on the day of the show. Prior to the show date samples may be sent or left at the Tobacco Experiment Station, Lancaster RD3. Most of the samples entered in the Lancaster Show will be held, conditioned, and entered in the State Show at Harrisburg if the exhibitor consents.

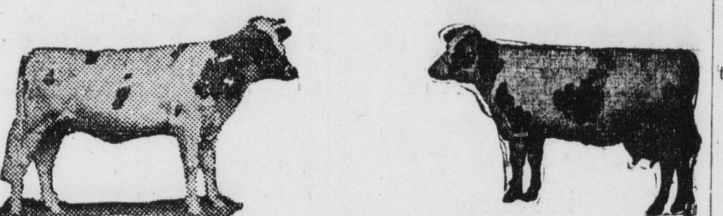
