It Appears As Though Boroughs May Adopt The Manager System

The county's only borough manager believes that more local boroughs will turn towards this form of government in the near future.

This is the opinion of Carl Fuehrer, thirty-nine, borough manager at Ephrata for the past four and one-half years.

Several Lancaster County boroughs, he disclosed have been making inquiries about the operation of Ephrata's manager system. Boroughs where interest is reported growing are understood to include Elizabethtown and New Holland.

Fuehrer revealed that his duties included those of borough engineer, building inspector, secretary of council, water, electric and sewer plant manager, head of the street department, and manager of the town's general information bureau.

"In fact," he added, "as borough manager I run practically everything but the police department. That comes under the direct supervision of the burgess and is the on-councilmanic department not under the manager.

The council manager system of government is the best set up for any community. Council is like private industry versus the corporation is operated by a manager under a board of directors which compares to our council. It has been proven best in business and best for municipalities.

Fuehrer disclosed that there are 36 borough managers in the state, and that three Pennsylvania townships also operate under this system. The smallest state borough under the manager form is Osborne with 529 population.

In the nation, 653 cities and nine counties are under managers.
