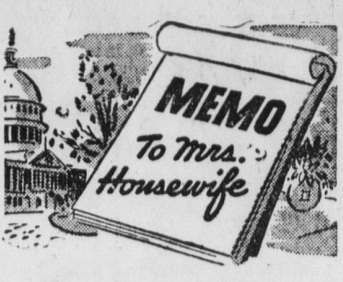


Prevent Cannibalism By Good Management

Keeping Chicks Active Real Secret of Success By W. J. DRYDEN Chicks will seldom be cannibalistic if provided with proper brooder and range space, correct temperature and air control and a balanced ration, properly fed. They must be kept alert and active. Only the mistreated, sluggish chick will turn to cannibalism.



Baby chicks must be managed right to prevent cannibalism. ing baby chicks. Give them all they will eat at all times and provide plenty of eating troughs. When the chicks are four to five weeks old they may be given grain, and made to scratch for it.
