

'Beyond Our Own' To Be Shown Here

The feature length film, "Beyond Our Own," will be shown in Trinity Lutheran Church, on Sunday evening, January 25, at 7:00 p.m.

"Beyond Our Own" was produced in Hollywood, with the film capital's stars and technical direction, through Protestant joint cooperation. Thirteen communions, working together through the Protestant Film Commission, shared in its financing and sponsorship.

"Beyond Our Own" is a vivid and gripping drama of the life story of two brothers, one a doctor and the other a lawyer, holding opposing views of the purpose and meaning of life. This well-integrated story shows the contrast between a life lived with Christ and a life lived without Christ.

Reviews by motion picture critics of leading newspapers and theatrical trade papers praised the film as the best of its kind ever released and described it as a first quality production. One reviewer commented, "Although intended for showings in churches, schools and before civic groups, it's easily good enough to rate bookings in any theatre in the country."

This picture also gives emphasis to the theme of evangelism which is, a movement foremost in Protestant thinking and effort at this time.

...you're one of those girls who's thinking of dyeing or bleaching a lock of hair on your pompadour while the rest is kept the same color, here's a warning from beauty experts. Some dyes on the market cause skin rashes if improperly used. So be careful; after all it's just a tad.

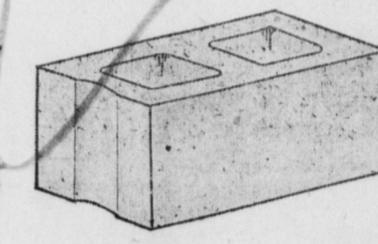
