The Mount Joy Sportsmen's meeting was held Monday, Feb. 9, with 22 members present.

The Club decided to buy 2 electric brooders to accommodate 500 day old chicks this summer.

On Sunday, February 15, the members will meet at Brady Hess's at 1 p.m. to go feed game. Due to the heavy snowfall recently it has been hard for the birds to secure food, so we have taken it upon ourselves to help them. Your donations of corn will be gladly accepted.
