MAKING GENERAL CHECKUP ON UNLICENSED DOGS

On February 15th, 1948, a general check up was started for owners of unlicensed dogs.

All persons found owning or harboring unlicensed dogs will be prosecuted without exception.

It is not the wish of the Bureau of Animal Industry or your local enforcement officer to make these prosecutions and it is hoped dog owners will take advantage of this warning and purchase their 1948 dog license at once.

The purpose of this check up is to license all dogs having homes and owners and to distinguish them from the stray and homeless dog.

All dogs not bearing a current license tag are considered strays and may be disposed of by any officer on sight.

The law requires you to put the license tag on the dogs collar and to be worn at all times.

A fee of \$2.00 is paid by the Commonwealth to officers and constables for each stray dog disposed of and forms for reporting same will be secured from your local Bureau of Animal Industry, Harrisburg, Pa.

Public Meeting On Control of Weeds

A morning and an afternoon Agricultural Extension meeting will be staged at the Farm Bureau on Friday, March 5th, starting at 10:00 a.m.

Many farmers, gardeners, and commercial vegetable growers are much interested in the control of weeds. The use of 2-4D for this purpose is now a red hot subject in many quarters.

The general control of weeds and particularly the experiences with the use of 2-4D in Pennsylvania will be discussed by George H. Berggren, of State College who has devoted most of his time to this subject for more than a year.

The afternoon session starting at 1:30 p.m. will be devoted to the fertilization of crops and to the conservation of soil.

J. B. R. Dickey, Extension agronomist from State College, will lead the discussion on the latest information on the fertilization of soil in Pennsylvania. This will include kinds and amounts of fertilizers and when and how to apply them.

The Lancaster County Agent will lead a general discussion on the importance of preventing erosion and some of the methods to be employed in controlling erosion.

Most of this period will be given to general discussion by men who have done something about it.

Selective Service Now Under PNG

Appointment of 16 former Army officers to the newly-activated state staff of the Pennsylvania National Guard was announced today by Brig. Gen. Frank A. Weber, Adjutant General of Pennsylvania.

Designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, the outfit is under the command of General Weber and has the job of initiating any future selective service system that might be needed in Pennsylvania as well as serving as an administration section for operation of the troops of PNG.

General Weber and his officers and men stood inspection for federal recognition last Friday at the Harrisburg Military Post.

When fully organized the staff will consist of 57 officers and 90 enlisted men. The selective service element will be organized at a strength of 27 officers and 44 enlisted men, and the national guard section, 30 officers and 46 men.

Trained former selective service personnel are being utilized wherever possible to form the draft section which will handle the planning and administration for Pennsylvania's selective service system in the event Congress passes another draft act. The other section will take care of all administrative matters pertaining to the National Guard and service as the office of records while the troops are not on active federal duty.

(From Page 1) ing macadam surfaces on "Farm to market" roads in the rural areas. The stone to be purchased also will be utilized for surface treatment.

The surface treatment work will get under way about May 15. The program this year has been approved for 3,253 miles. In 1947 the Department completed 3,695 miles of surface treatment.

The mileage of surface treatment approved by the various engineering districts follows:

- District 1, Franklin, 287 miles; District 2, Clearfield, 267 miles; District 3, Williamsport, 244 miles; District 4, Scranton, 292 miles; District 5, Allentown, 310 miles; District 6, Ardmore, 262 miles; District 8, Harrisburg, 531 miles; District 9, Hollidaysburg, 257 miles; District 10, Indiana, 294 miles; District 11, Pittsburgh, 275 miles; District 12, Uniontown, 234 miles.

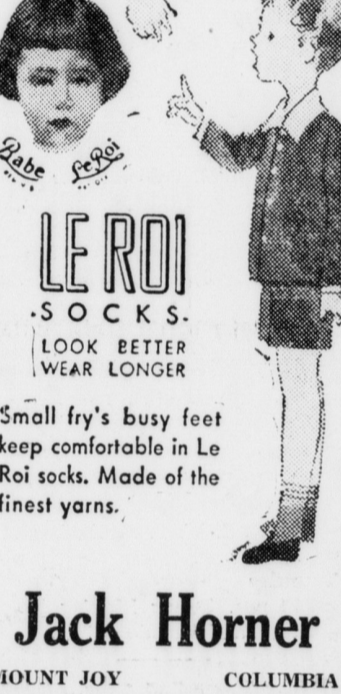
