January 31, 1942 will be enrolled in September, 1948.

2. These children must be registered for and attend the pre school clinic in the Grade School, Thursday, May 6, 1948 at any time between the hours of 8:30 to 4:30. Registration cards can be secured from the Grade School office, if not already filled in. Cards should be returned to Mr. Heaps as soon as possible.

3. Vaccination and birth certificates must be presented on May 6. At the pre-school clinic there will be on duty a medical examiner, a dental examiner, a registered nurse, and clerk, in addition to the County Director and member of the Mount Joy Primary Faculty.

Questions concerning registration and the clinic should be referred to Mr. C. R. Heaps at the Grade School.

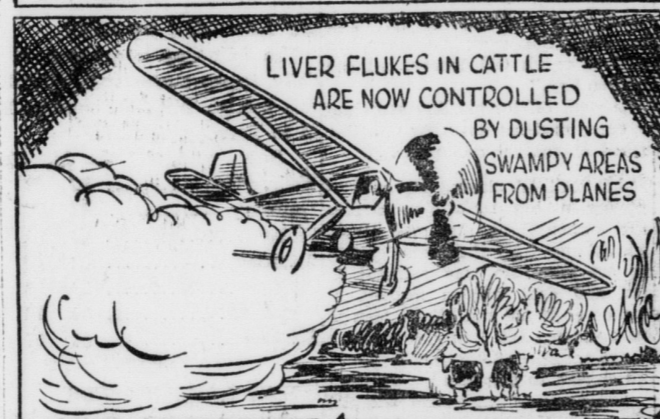
