Week's Best Recipe

Cranberry Grahams: 1 can jellied cranberry sauce, 1-2 t cinnamon, 16 graham crackers, 1-2 pt. heavy cream, whipped, 1-2 t vanilla, 1 T sugar, 1-4 c chopped nuts. Allow four graham crackers for each serving. Crush cranberry sauce with fork in the can. Add cinnamon mixture on first, second and third crackers. Top with fourth. Whip cream until stiff. Add sugar and vanilla. Cover each cranberry-graham stack, sides and top, with whipped cream. Sprinkle with chopped nut meats. Place in refrigerator to chill. Let stand 6 to 8 hours, for crackers to absorb the moisture.

Spring Hats
Spring millinery is already beginning to be displayed by hat manufacturers. There is a liberal use of flowers, veils, ribbons. Brims are larger and very flattering. Sailors are in many styles and worn on various slants. Colors run rampant, a deep bluish green hat trimmed in cream colored ribbon, natural shantung flowers and black velvet ribbon on a sailor, pale pink straws, lacey braids trimmed in roses, honey beige with gray and yellow striped ribbon, red straw trimmed with red wings and blue veiling, cornflower blue trimmed in pink flowers. Something to look forward to, ladies.

Care Of Kitchenware
Use a non-alkali soap and steel wool to keep aluminum shiny and bright. Have a fine steel wool, however, so it won't scratch off the polish. Porcelain, glass and enamelware are better cleaned without abrasives. By soaking the utensils at once, the job of cleaning is much easier. Use wooden spoons when stirring foods in enamelware. Use mild soap for cleaning. If enamel becomes stained, rub with soda, wash, rinse and dry. The stained enamel coffee pot may be cleaned with a weak solution of vinegar and water to remove the discoloration.

quartette. Following this Warren Bentzel introduced the speaker Rev. Russel E. Etter of Iona, Pa. who spoke on Sunday School work. A few of the highlights of his talk was first to congratulate the various churches represented for the fine spirit of cooperation and getting together for the purpose of sharing good ideas that can be used within the Sunday schools.

A very strong and good point brought out by Rev. Etter was concerning the attendance. He said that if we are to maintain our present attendance and hope to increase it we must have friendship and fellowship in the Sunday School. Another very important point to get and to hold members, was to have an interesting teacher, one who can hold the attention of his or her pupils. He stated that it was not so much what they taught, but more what he or she is from the standpoint of Christian Character and christian loyalty, for each teacher must set an example.

Criticizing very much the teacher who went home after Sunday school, and did not stay for church. This, said Rev. Etter, will soon have a bad effect on the children in the class, for they will feel if the teacher does not stay, why should they. Rev. Etter had many very good points that would be helpful to any teacher in any Sunday school.

Following Rev. Etter's talk, the meeting opened for discussion and questions. One question asked if the superintendents of the Sunday school should teach a class, and the answer Rev. Etter gave was a NO. In the discussion Rev. Etter brought out that when children come into the Sunday school, we do not actually have them until we get mother and dad in also. He also brought out a point stating that there is too much difference between the church and the Sunday school, that they do not work together enough.

One very important question brought up was how to recruit new members, especially among the children. Rev. Etter said the best recruits and Sunday school is the children already in, for if the Sunday school is interested and they like it, they will tell others and even bring them in.

Truly this was a very fine meeting and the starting of this Sunday School Workers Group, is the best thing that has happened to the Sunday schools here in Mount Joy. There were many teachers who were absent but the attendance was most gratifying. In the very near future, the Superintendents and the assistants will meet to organize, and every three months there will be a meeting similar to the one held Monday evening, with plenty of round table discussion.
