ment on a 6 inch special subgrade. It will consist of two 11 foot lanes separated by a 4 foot division strip.  
The Swanger contract calls for a concrete arch over Chickies Creek which will have a span of 98 ft.  
It will be necessary to relocate a township road on the property of Enos and Miriam Witmer for a distance of 850 feet in the vicinity of the new structure. The stream channel will be changed to provide the highway and this involves 10,421 cubic yards of excavation.  
In addition Swanger will build six other concrete structures with spans varying from 5 to 10 feet. The bridge work by this contractor will require 210,919 pounds of steel reinforcing bars.  
The Swanger contract is to be finished in 165 working days.  
The bridge to carry U. S. Route 230 over the Reading tracks under the Good contract will be an I-beam structure with a span of 48 feet. It will have a 5 foot walk for pedestrians on the south side. This structure will require 1999 cubic yards of concrete, 90,676 pounds of steel bars and 135,100 pounds of structural steel. It will have a roadway 52 feet wide.  
A concrete rigid frame bridge is planned to carry the highway over the Little Conestoga Creek. It will consist of two spans of 74 feet and one of 63 feet. There will be a 5 foot walk in the south side. Its construction will take 8600 pounds of structural steel, 324,180 pounds of steel bars and 1150 cubic yards of concrete.  
In addition Good will construct a concrete arch with a span of 18 feet. It will be 101 feet in length and have a roadway 68 feet wide.  
There are 160 working days allowed for completion of the Good contract.
