POPPY DAY — MAY 29TH

Disabled veterans of both wars work side by side in veterans hospitals throughout the country during the winter and spring making memorial poppies.



The poppies are fashioned by hand, veterans working in their beds, in wheel chairs or in occupational therapy shops. The flowers are made of crepe paper in replica of the little wild poppies of France and Flanders, which grew on battlefields and cemeteries of the two world wars.

EAST DONEGAL BOARD TO SPONSOR TWO PLAYGROUNDS

The East Donegal Twp. School Board will sponsor two playgrounds this summer under the Extension Education Act. The one playground will be at Florin and the other one at Maytown. Hunters who use their automobiles and spotlights for killing deer at night may find themselves minus the vehicles. The State Game Commission announced a stepped-up drive against such violations, and warned it would confiscate the cars of hunters found guilty.
