 Before leaving for the field in February 1926 both Mr. and Mrs. Thompson were associated with Dr. P. W. Philpott in the Hamilton, Ontario, Tabernacle, thus giving them wide experience in evangelistic and educational work, and through long years of active association with Latin America Mission have achieved exceptional success in ministering to the young people of the Bible Seminary in San Jose, Costa Rica.
 At the present time Mrs. Thompson is designated as the director of the business of the Latin America Mission office in Ridgefield Park, New Jersey, in addition to serving as a deputation worker representing Costa Rica.
 Saturday evening at 7:30 p. m. Mrs. Thompson will show slides and speak of the need of the work, and of the results in Costa Rica.
 On Sunday she will speak at 10:30 a.m. and at 7:30 p.m. bringing messages that will challenge young and old.
 Mrs. Thompson has won a warm spot in the hearts of many having been one of the speakers at the Interdenominational Missionary Conference held in Mount Joy October a year ago. Many of her friends will be happy to hear of her return at this time.

BIG INCREASE IN THE USE OF TRACTORS ON FARMS
 Use of tractors on the nation's farms has increased 181%—1,665,000 units — since 1931, according to a recent survey made by one prominent industrial engineering firm for Apex Equipment Corporation of Chicago, leading producer of 300-gallon prefabricated farm fuel storage tanks of both gravity-flow and skid-mounted types.
 During this same period, farmers increased their usage of motor trucks by 650,000 — 72.2%—resulting in mechanized farming on a broad scale. Today, the horse population on American farms is 5,000,000 below that of 1931, while the mule count is off 2,000,000.

The owners of the above are hereby warned and unless they cooperate will be dealt with accordingly. Let this be a warning.


