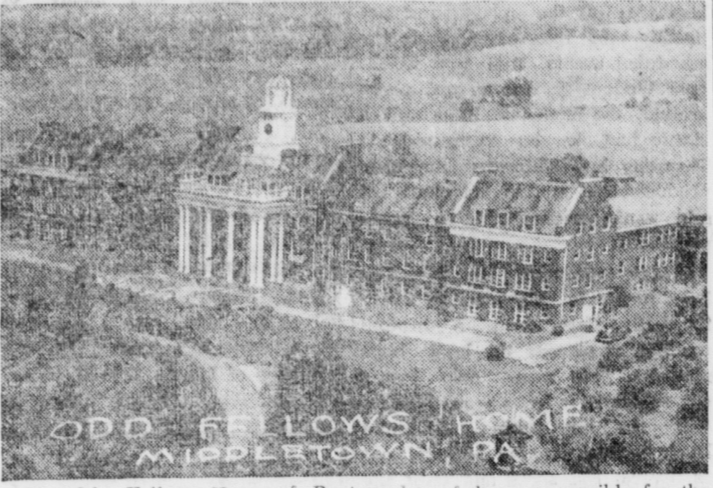

Odd Fellows Home, Middletown, To Welcome Visitors, Sat., Aug. 21



The Odd Fellows Home of Pa., one of the eight situated in the Keystone State, represents a million dollar investment in fraternal benevolence. Its imposing main building, crowning a hill close to the Phila. and Harrisburg Highway, is a gigantic structure containing 238 rooms besides kitchen, dining room, library, sun parlors, chapel infirmary and a number of special rooms.

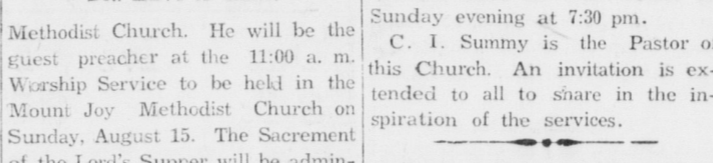
When the cornerstone of the present building was laid in 1924, the Haven could already look back on a half century of distinguished service in behalf of aged and indigent brothers. Its first site, Vine and 65th Sts. in Philadelphia, was acquired in 1876, and welcomed its first guest the following January.

From its vantage point - overlooking the Susquehanna River the Home reflects the labors and high resolve of those responsible for the 138 residents now dwelling there. From its own fields comes the meat and produce for the dining room tables. And from the generosity of hundreds of Pa. Odd Fellows who reside in this vicinity comes the funds to make this Middletown Home a true Haven for the aged and infirm.

On Sat., August 21, the Middletown Home, in observance of its Second Home Day, will welcome as its visitors the Odd Fellows from the central and the eastern portions of Pa. An elaborate afternoon program has been planned for this occasion. Home inspection by the visitors will be followed by a concert rendered by the Bainbridge, Pa. Odd Fellows Band and field day competitive drills under the auspices of the Patriarchs Militant. State Senator Frank W. Ruth will give an address. Lunch will be available for the visitors.

The Rev. Levi H. Zerr, D.D., is the Superintendent of the West District, Philadelphia Conference, of The

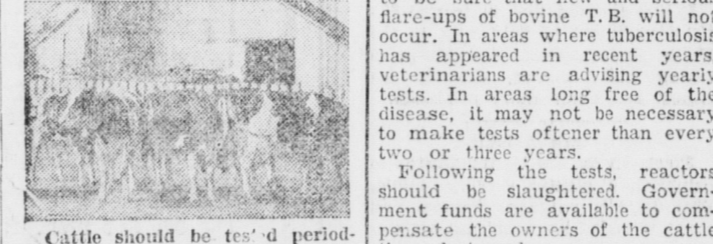

HEALTH HINTS FOR LIVESTOCK

NEW 'HOT SPOTS' FOR BOVINE T.B.
Too many people think that tuberculosis of cattle is a thing of the past in this country. True, this disease has been pretty well beaten—thanks to an intensive 25-year fight by veterinarians, the Bureau of Animal Industry and livestock owners. No county in the nation reports a ratio of more than one case in every 200 cattle.



But the menace is not dead. New centers of infection have been reported recently and veterinary authorities are afraid we may slip back too quickly in our efforts to control the disease. As long as a single infected animal remains, there will always be danger of spreading tuberculosis to a disastrous number of cattle. The last source of infection must be eliminated before we can let up in this fight.

This year, as in the past, we plan to have missionaries here from many parts of the world. Over 20 Missionaries.

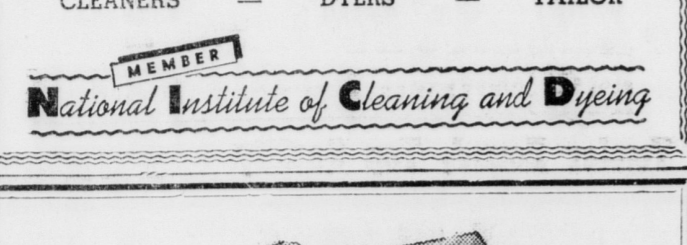

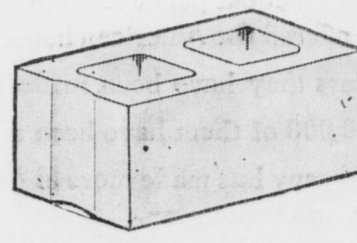

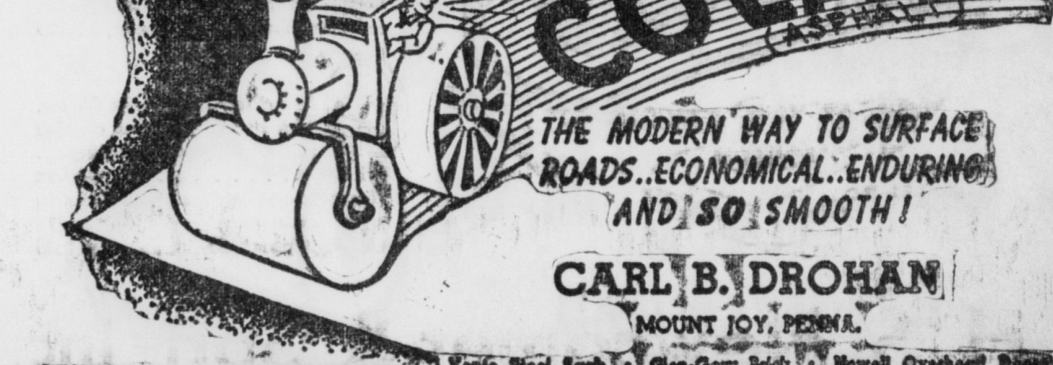
